# Hiking offers us all a chance to unplug from the stresses of daily life and reconnect with our natural surroundings. At Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge, each season brings new sights and sounds that can help recharge your soul and lift your spirits.

#### **Self Guided Auto Tour**

Enjoy the Refuge with an audio narrative tour from the comfort of your car! The tour offers a stop by stop experience to learn about Hagerman history, Refuge purposes, and local flora and fauna. Look for the Auto tour sign when you arrive at the Visitor Center.



#### **Option 1 - Phone**

Scan the QR code by opening the camera on your phone and focusing it over the QR code until a website link appears. Follow the link to listen to the tour.



#### Option 2 - CD

Come to the Visitor Center to check out a CD to play in your car. Please return the CD before the visitor center closes at 4PM.

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#### Haller's Haven - 2.75 Miles

Enjoy a great view of the Refuge from an easy partial loop along Lake Texoma. Along the way you'll first pass Picnic Pond, then Dead Woman's pond which is a great place to see woodpeckers, wading birds, and hawks.

#### Raasch - 3 Miles

Walk down and back through open fields managed for wildlife and bottomland hardwood forests while searching for Eastern Bluebirds and Painted Buntings.

Harris Creek - Multiple Loop Options Take the Refuge's most popular easy trail and choose from a 0.33 mile ADA loop, a 0.5 mile loop, or a 0.73 mile loop. Features include several ponds and a photo blind.

#### Crow Hill - 0.75 Miles

Discover hilly terrain on a short heavily wooded loop. Features include creeks and educational panels with Refuge information.

#### Meadow Pond - 5.7 Miles

Wander down and back over the route of the historic KATY railroad track. After a 10 minute walk you will arrive at the beautiful Deaver Pond. Come in July when the American Lotus plants are in bloom on Meadow Pond located 3 miles down the trail.

#### **Access**

The Refuge is open every day from sunrise until sunset.

#### **Bicycles**

**ESPONSIBLY** 

Biking is a good way to see wildlife, learn about habitats, and photograph nature at Hagerman. Refuge trails such as Haller's Haven and Meadow Pond are good multi-use trails for biking. E-bikes are permitted on any refuge roads and trails where traditional bicycle use is allowed. Remember to yield to pedestrians.

#### Pets

Leashed pets are allowed on the refuge. Only service animals are permitted to enter the visitor center.
