Past Events

Photo Club Meeting - January 21, 2023

Larry Howard gave a presentation on macro photography. He brought in an array of equipment that is used for macro. Larry displayed and explained recommended equipment: tripod, sandbag, camera clamp, remote release or cable release, lens reversing ring, lens coupling ring, diopters, extension tubes, bellows unit, macro lens, and macro slide rail.

A few main factors to consider in macro photography are depth-of-field, background/subject merger, focal length of lens, and shutter speed to prevent mirror slaps with DSLR cameras

Larry gave many useful tips, including.

- Pick a background that is pleasing in tone and does not merge with your subject. Try to have background far enough away to render it out of focus.
- The longer focal length of the lens you are using the more extensions you must use to get close to the subject. The more magnification you use the more useful the macro-slider will be.
- Whenever you can, keep the camera as close to parallel to the subject as possible to ensure a more overall plane of sharpness on the subject.
- As far as lighting on a subject, use a reflective surface on a sunny day to light your subject. If the day is very cloudy, you might try a flash unit.
- When you want to get really close to your subjects or want a lot
 of magnification, you will likely need to use a sandbag, camera
 clamp or tripod to steady the camera. A tripod is frequently
 used and one that has the capability to go low to the ground is
 your best choice with either a ball head of a pan/tilt head.

Larry has been a professor of photography since 1973 and taught photography classes in portrait, weddings, nature, wildlife, food, architecture, and photo journalism. Larry lives in Tom Bean, Texas, with his wife and they have been married 54 years. He is a fifth generation Texan and an army veteran.
