Kathy Whaley Refuge Manager

- Managed 200-acres of moist soil units along Wildlife Drive
- Snow and Ross' Goose population peaked at about 10,000 in December
- Completed a deferred maintenance project at Elm Pond
- Completed mechanical treatment and prescribed burning of 1,050 acres in the Goode Unit
- Completed rehabilitation of the 5 small ponds along Harris Creek Trail
- An aerial feral hog control contractor eliminated 200 hogs in January
- Special Use Permits were issued to four universities and the Texas Forest Service to conduct Painted Bunting, mammal, reptile, and insect surveys and monitoring.
- Local reptile expert Jordan Foster documented the first record of a Massasauga (rattlesnake) in Montague County on the Nocona Unit
- Worked with oil & gas operator Jetta Operating to fund a Caterpillar
 299D3 EX LM with land management package
- Oil and gas specialist Mary Maddux worked with producers to identify areas that needed either preventive or remediation actions for oil and saltwater spills on refuge lands.
- Butterfly research on Monarchs and Frosted Elfins (candidate for listing as threatened being monitored in the Sandy Unit)

- An estimated 238,675 people visited HNWR in 2022
- 80 active volunteers donated 7,130 hours to support HNWR activities
- Partnered with FoH to complete a new 1,400 sq. ft. Environmental Education Pavilion
- Bluestem TMN volunteered >500 hours to support HNWR activities
- Staff represented HNWR at several outreach venues
- Educators are now able to request ranger-led environmental education programs online (at the refuge or off-site)
- Hosted several Boy and Girl Scout Troops


Membership Chart
