SONGBIRDS

Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge is home to more than 338 recorded species of birds. Some are permanent residents while others come from as far away as Canada seeking warmer weather during the winter months. Neotropical migrant songbirds arrive during spring months. Many species nest here, while others travel further north. In October, they head south for warmer climates.

As you enjoy the refuge today look for these songbirds in forests, wetlands, fields, and at the water's edge. Take notice of their color and shape, and see how many you can find. Songbirds are some of the most colorful birds on Earth!


